

Year 5 Overview for Autumn Term 2:2

Reading:	Word meaning - children will be reading unfamiliar words and find words with closest meaning. They will make connections to prior learning and use this to answer a range of styles and questions.
Writing:	Arguments 1 sided Arguments 2 sided
Maths:	In Maths, we will be learning about decimals, fraction and percentages. Children will be learning how to add and subtract different fractions as well as multiplying and dividing fractions. They will also learn to convert improper fractions to mixed numbers. In terms of percentages, they will learn to convert them into decimals and fractions. This will all lead into solving test-based questions.
Science:	This term we will be looking at different forces such as air resistance, gravity, frictions including levers and pulleys.
RE:	Leadership - participating and willing to lead. Children will become more aware of the need for social interaction and social responsibility. They will learn how individuals influence the nature of society. Being modest and listening to others. Children will explore the concept of being humble about their opinions and beliefs
Non-Core:	Geography - Ancient Greece

	<p>Land use - features. Trade links: How did Greece's geography influence trade (e.g. the sea.) Mountains, coastline and climate. 6 figure grid reference map of Ancient Greece. Plot the different islands on. Include 8-point compass.</p> <p>Art - Drawing. Over the half term, children will: Exploring existing Greek artwork and create a replicated section, focusing on line. Produce a still life drawing of a natural item to show tone, highlights and shadow. Create a proportional drawing of a figure. Create drawings to show movement of characters in different poses. Explore use of mediums and chose most effective for their final piece. Produce a strip of figure drawings to show 'A day in the life of a Greek'</p>
PSHE:	<p>How can we help in an accident or emergency? Children will learn how to carry out basic first aid, what to do when somebody has a head injury and how to seek adult help.</p>
PE:	<p>Children will be moving onto tennis and cricket, where they will be learning a range of skills on using the bats and rackets. These skills will then lead the children to playing games where they can implement the skills they have been taught.</p>
