Reading:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Our text will focus on our topic of Migration. We will be reading the text ‘Street Child.’ • Explain - author’s language choice and meaning. • Summarise – ordering events/statements.
Writing:	<p>The following genres will be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Classic stories from the past • Diaries <p>Skills to focus on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Long and short sentences for impact • Apostrophes • Reported speech
Maths:	Decimals, geometry and measurements
Science:	<p>Forces</p> <p>Pupils should explore falling objects and raise questions about the effects of air resistance.</p> <p>Pupils should explore the effects of friction on movement and find out how it slows or stops moving objects, for example, by observing the effects of a brake on a bicycle wheel.</p> <p>Pupils might work scientifically by: exploring falling paper cones or cup-cake cases and designing and making a variety of parachutes and carrying out fair tests to determine which designs are the most effective.</p>
