Year 4 Overview for Autumn Term 1.1

Reading:	This half term, we will be looking at a book called 'Romans on the Rampage' linking to our Learning for Life subjects (History
	and Geography). We will be focusing on looking at question words and how best to answer these questions. We will also
	be looking at identifying unknown words and synonyms for different words. Children will practice reading aloud and
	examine the words contained within a text including looking at their definitions and how they contribute to
	meaning. They will also begin to practice and improve their comprehension skills.
	Children are encouraged to take books out from the library where they visit our own school library every fortnight. Please
	ensure these books are returned in time and in good condition. As well as that, children take book every Friday which is
	according to their reading ability.
	READING is paramount to any learning so please ensure your child reads more at home.
Writing:	The pupils will look at character and setting descriptions, learning how to enhance their writing by adding
	adjectives and adverbials to create vivid imagery and atmosphere. They will also explore writing to inform and
	writing to persuade, all linked to their topic of invasions, allowing them to draw on historical knowledge to support
	their ideas. Greater focus will be placed upon punctuation and ensuring their writing makes sense, with regular
	opportunities to edit and improve their work. Pupils will be encouraged to use varied sentence structures and
	conjunctions to extend their ideas and improve fluency. Through model texts and shared writing, they will develop
	an understanding of how tone and purpose influence language choices. Peer and self-assessment will be embedded
	to help children reflect on their progress and take ownership of their writing.





Mathe	Place Value:
	The pupils will learn about Roman Numerals, learning to write and read Roman Numerals up to 100 (and in some
	cases 1000). Following this the pupils will then look at place value. They will also look at reading and writing up
	to 4- digit numbers, recognising the place value of each column and rounding to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.
	Calculation:
	Children will learn column methods of addition and subtraction. They will practice these in the arithmetic format
	as well as solving real-life situation problems. They will also look at multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and
	1000. Finally the pupils will look at fractions including recognising the decimal and percentage equivalent of
	common fractions. Children are encouraged to learn their timetable - TTrockstar log in details has been given to
	all children to practice at home.
Science:	Teeth: The pupils will study the teeth that we have within the human body. They will examine the impact of diet
	on teeth and what different teeth are used for. We will also look at looking after teeth and what causes damage to
	them. Pupils will compare the teeth of carnivores, herbivores, and omnivores to understand how diet influences
	tooth structure and function. Children will identify digestive organs and their functions, and create their own
	digestive system model to explore what happens to food once it enters the body. As part of their learning, pupils
	will draw and label the different types of human teeth—incisors, canines, premolars, and molars—and describe the
	function of each.
RE:	Children will look at Christianity, Islam and Hinduism. This term, they will be able to understand the difference
	between happiness and spiritual joy. We covered the following dispositions: Being Thankful, Being reflective and
	self critical. They will then look at joy by Hindu celebration of Diwali Celebrations. They will also explore the
	parents as gift from Allah. In addition, children will understand what harvest festival is and distribution of
	harvest food.
Non-Core:	Topic: Invasions





	Learning through: History, Geography, Art and Design Pupils will examine invasions through looking at Ancient Rome. They will discover the civilization of the Ancient Romans by studying their cultures and customs. The pupils will then examine the Romans invasion of Britain including studying the Iceni rebellion led by Queen Boudicca. Children will learn to locate Italy in European maps, globes and digital maps. They will look deeper into what is volcano, river and mountains. Children will find out how Romans travelled from Rome to Britain as well as using grid reference and compass.
PSHE:	Throughout this term, children will immerse into our school value 'Respect'. They will understand what tolerance and mutual respect is and how to demonstrate that in everyday life. Children will also look closely at what self-respect and individuality means.
PE:	Your child will build their physical skills through basketball by learning how to defend, attack, pass, throw, dribble, and shoot. They will also learn the rules of the game and what a foul is. Running will be practised to help improve their speed and movement during games. All children will have the opportunity to take part in swimming this half term.
Computing:	By the end of the term, children will be able: Discuss what internet and phone safety is. They will look into what it means by online safety before moving on to using Microsoft Powerpoint.

Mans	Children will learn column methods of addition and subtraction. They will practice these in the arithmetic format
	as well as solving real-life situation problems. They will also look at multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and
	1000. They will look at a range of real life problems to solve addition, subtraction, multiplication and division
	problems. Finally, children will move onto measure and calculate perimeter of rectilinear figure in m, cm, and
	mm
Science:	This half term, children will be learning about classification, where they will be looking at the features used to
	identify and group animals. They will learn about food chains and habitats and will create their own to show how
	energy is transferred between living things.
	Children will be developing their scientific skills by using simple classification keys to group and sort animals
	based on observable characteristics. They will be making careful observations, recording findings in tables and
	diagrams, and using scientific vocabulary to explain their ideas. Children will also be learning how living things
	depend on each other and how changes to habitats can affect the organisms that live there.

	what did Romans do for Britain.

Year 4 Overview for Spring Term 2.1

Your Teaching staff are: Mrs. Mahamud, Miss Rafagat and Mr. Tromans

Reading:	This half term, children will be reading a book called Anglo-Saxon Boy, linking to their Learning for Life subjects (History and Geography - Anglo-Saxons). Children will be focusing on making inferences, answering retrieval questions, and summarising short pieces of text. They will be identifying unknown words and finding synonyms to expand their vocabulary.
	Children will be practising reading aloud and examining the words within a text, looking at their definitions and how they contribute to meaning. They will be improving their comprehension skills through regular reading activities. Children will also be exploring the author's choice of words—thinking about why certain words or phrases were used and how they help to create mood, build character, or add detail to the setting. Children will be encouraged to read aloud with clear expression, adjusting their tone and volume to reflect the mood and meaning of the text. They will learn how punctuation—such as commas, exclamation marks, and question marks—can guide their voice and help bring the story to life for listeners. Children are encouraged to take books out from the library where when they visit our own school library every fortnight. Please ensure these books are returned in time and in good condition. As well as that, children take book every Friday which is according to their reading ability. Please listen to your child read.
Writing:	READING is paramount to any learning so please ensure your child reads more at home. This half term, Children will focus on writing a build up to a problem and writing letters. The skills they will

Maths:	This half term, children will continue to work on multiplication and division. They will recognize and use factor
	pairs. They will multiply and divide 2,3- and 4-digit numbers by one-digit number using formal method. They
	will continue to use I and 2 steps word problems in multiplication and division. Children will also look at Area by
	counting squares in a rectilinear shape.
	PLEASE ensure your children are learning their times table at home.
Science:	This half term, children will look at 'State of Matter' They will compare and group materials together, according to
	solid, liquid and gas. They will look at the properties and features of these materials. Through experiment,
	children will look at and describe changes that occur when materials are heated and cooled. They will look at
	evaporation and condensation in the water cycle.
RE:	Disposition children will work on are:
	Being modest and listening to others
	 Cultivating Inclusion, Identity and belonging.
	Through Christianity, children will understand that the significance of Jesus' teaching is shown in the actions by
	his followers. They will look at the concept of mutual respect and the concept of mutual listening and
	participation. Through Sikhism, children will explore the Sikh Amrit ceremony.
Non-Core:	Topic: Geography
	Changing Britain - The Anglo-Saxons: Children will explore where the Anglo-Saxons came from and why they
	chose to settle in Britain. They will investigate the routes they took and learn what a settlement is, including the
	key features that make a good one. Pupils will study how Anglo-Saxon settlements developed over time, using





	maps and grid references to locate and describe changes. They will also learn how to use compass points,
	following directions using all eight points of the compass.
	As part of their Year 4 geography and history skills, children will practise interpreting maps, using coordinates,
	and applying directional language. They will begin to understand historical timelines and use evidence to compare
	Anglo-Saxon life with modern-day Britain, developing their ability to ask and answer questions about the past.
PSHE:	Throughout this half term, children will immerse into our school value 'Determination'
	To understand what big emotions are and how they can affect our reactions To know what a trigger is and begin to develop
	an understanding of my triggers. They will learn what is meant by 'loss' and learn about some of the feelings associated
	with grief after someone die
PE:	Your child will be developing their physical skills through Dodgeball and Dance.
	Children will improve on key skills used in dodgeball such as throwing, dodging and catching. The learn how to
	apply simple tactics to the game to outwit their opponent. In dodgeball, pupils achieve this by hitting opponents
	with a ball whilst avoiding being hit.
	In dance, they will focus on creating characters and narrative through movement and gesture. They gain
	inspiration from a range of stimuli, working individually, in pairs and small groups. In dance as a whole, pupils
	think about how to use movement to explore and communicate ideas and issues, and their own feelings and
	thoughts.
Computing:	Children to explore using sketches school - go through and explore the range available to use. Also explain how
	to change the colour of the brushes. Children to experiment with the above and draw a picture of a landscape -
	see flip for some simple examples.

	questions and then focusing on vocabulary and inference.

Maths:	This half term, children will recognise and show, using diagrams, families of common equivalent fractions. They
	will solve problems involving increasingly harder fractions to calculate quantities, fractions to divide quantities
	including non-unit fractions where the answer is whole number. Children will add and subtract fractions using
	the same denominator. They will then move onto recognizing and writing decimal equivalents of number tenths
	and hundredths. They will solve simple measure and money problems involving fractions and decimals.
	PLEASE ensure your children are learning their times table at home.
Science:	This half term, children will look at Sound. Children will be identifying how sounds are made and associating
	sound with vibration. They will be looking closely at the ear, labelling and identifying the functions of each part.
	They will then explore how sound and vibration travel through the medium of the ear.
	Children will be developing their scientific enquiry skills by making observations, asking questions, and recording
	findings using diagrams and labelled drawings. They will be using key vocabulary to describe processes and will
	begin to explain their understanding using clear, structured sentences appropriate for Year 4.

	Children will explore where Anglo-Saxons come from and why did they invade Britain. They will look at different historical event such as Battle of Badon. They will understand what society was like at different at a specific time period in Britain. Through art and culture, children will explain what life was like in the past.
PSHE:	Throughout this half term, children will immerse into our school value 'Inspiration'
PE:	Your child will be developing their physical skills through Handball and Tag Rugby. In Yoga, children will learn about mindfulness and body awareness. They will learn yoga poses and techniques that will help them to connect their mind and body. The unit looks to improve wellbeing by building strength, flexibility and balance. The learning includes breathing and meditation taught through fun and engaging activities. In Handball, children will be encouraged to persevere when learning key skills such as throwing, catching, dribbling, shooting and principles of defending and attacking. Pupils will use their attacking skills to maintain possession in game situations.

Year 4 Overview for Summer Term 3:1

Your Teaching staff are: Mrs. Mahamud, Miss Rafaqat and Mr. Tromans

Reading:	Our class text is Charlie and the Chocolate Factory.
	This half term, children will be making predictions, inferences, and summaries from videos and texts of varying lengths. They will continue to answer retrieval questions and explore the meaning of unknown words by reading around the text.
	Children will be practising reading aloud with fluency, expression, volume, and punctuation awareness. They will revisit key skills such as prediction, retrieval, and analysing the author's choice of words to deepen their understanding and improve comprehension. Children will be exposed to a range of skills that they have learnt in previous terms. They will read with fluency and expression and identifying unknown words. They will then read around the text to find the meaning rather than using
	dictionaries. Children will answer retrieval, inference and prediction questions from seen and unseen text. They will summarize longer pieces of texts as well as looking at author's choice of words
	READING is paramount to any learning so please ensure your child reads more at home.
Writing:	Linking to our Learning for Life, children will write an explanation text about cotton spinning during the industrial
	revolution. In doing so, children use skills learnt previously as well as current skills to write an explanation text.
	In Writing, children will be writing an advert persuading people to visit Cadbury World. The skills they will
	learn to organize content by information and using past, present and future tense. They will also look at stories





	from other culture and rewrite events. They will learn how to create pace through speech, action and language choices.
Maths:	Calculation:
	Children will be exposed to comparing and ordering amounts of money and estimate change. They will do that
	through pictorial and abstract method. Children will also be looking at solving one step and two step word
	problems. Following on from money, we will move onto looking at digital and analogue clock (12 to 24 hour)
	Children are encouraged and supported to learn their timetables. National DFE test will be carried our in May.
	Please ensure children are learning their timetable at home. They can use Math frame timetable check on any of
	the devices available to them. It is free and they are used to using it.
Science:	Electricity: Children will be learning about what electricity is and the components needed to make a simple
	electrical circuit. They will be creating their own circuits and switches, then testing them to see if they work.
	Children will carry out experiments to investigate which materials are good conductors of electricity.
	As part of their Year 4 science skills, children will be working scientifically by making predictions, setting up fair
	tests, and recording their results using tables and diagrams. They will be learning to use scientific vocabulary to
	explain how circuits work and will begin to draw simple circuit diagrams using recognised symbols.
RE:	This half term, we will look at Islam, Christianity, and Judaism. Within that, we will explore the ten
	commandments as rules to live by. We will look at how Christians believe that the essence of ten commandments
	is love for God and love of others. We will also revisit the Islamic practice of the prayer - the second pillar of
	Islam,
	Disposition covered: Living by the Rules and Being temperate, self-disciplined and seeking contentment.





Non-Core:	Spain V Switzerland
	Throughout this term, children will look at civilization, climate, land use and location. Children will Identify and
	describe what places are like. They will use an atlas correctly and Identify seas and major cities and landmarks.
	Identify the position of the Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere, the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn,
	Arctic and Antarctic Circle. They will also be taught how to compare and contrast places. Use geographical
	vocabulary to communicate ideas.
PSHE:	Throughout this half term, children will immerse into our school value 'Honesty'
	Children will be learning how responsible choices—such as buying Fairtrade products—can support workers, protect
	natural resources, and promote fairness across the world. They will also reflect on their own habits and consider
	how small changes can lead to a more sustainable future
PE:	We will be practicing athletics and handball. Children will learn how to compete with each other as well as the
	importance of team work.
Computing:	We will look at an app called Sphero. Sphero is a robot ball with several features that can be controlled through
	mobile apps, including computer programs that the students build. The main features are: · Rolling. The Sphero can
	roll at a given speed and heading for a given amount of time.

Year 4 Overview for Summer Term 3:2

Your Teaching staff are: Mrs. Mahamud, Miss Rafaqat and Mr. Tromans Our Assistant Head Teacher is: Miss Gooch

Reading:	Our new book is called 'The Kensuke's Kingdom' - where a boy takes on a journey and is stranded in an Island where he meets Kensuke. It is a very exciting book and children will learn about different countries that he travels through. Children are encouraged to take books out from the library where when they visit our own school library every fortnight. Please ensure these books are returned in time and in good condition
Writing:	In Writing, children will be writing an advert persuading people to visit Cadbury World. The skills they will
	learn to organize content by information and using past, present and future tense. They will also look at stories
	from other culture and rewrite events. They will learn how to create pace through speech, action and language
	choices.
Maths:	Children will look at properties of shapes. They will identify acute and obtuse angles and compare and order
	angles up to two right angles. They will compare and classify geometric shapes including quadrilaterals and
	triangles based on their size and shapes. Children will also be looking at interpreting date
	They will look at and complete symmetrical lines in 2d shapes. They will also look at position and direction. In
	doing so, they will identify coordinates. They will plot and complete a given polygon. Children will describe
	movements between positions as translation of a given unit to the left or right, up or down.
Science:	Liwing Things and Their Habitats: This term, children will be learning all about living things and their habitats.
	They will recognise that living things can be grouped in a variety of ways and will explore and use classification





	keys to help group, identify, and name a range of living things in their local and wider environment. Children will
	learn how to create their own classification keys for different groups such as insects and plants.
	Children will be working scientifically by making careful observations, asking relevant questions, and recording
	findings using tables and diagrams. They will be encouraged to use scientific vocabulary to describe and compare
	living things, and to explain how classification helps us understand the diversity of life around us.
RE:	This term we will look at how faith can be an influence on behaviour and how the opinions of others may affect
	our behaviour. The children will also explore uniqueness and creativity and how these are gifts from God. We
	will also be looking at a range of creation stories from the Christianity, Islam, Sikh and Hindu religions.
	Dispositions covered:

Non-Core:	Geography - Europe
	Children will look at atlases and maps and identify where Turkey is on an European map. They will look at how
	Turkey's weather and climate effected their position on the map. They will look at surrounding countries and seas
	near Turkey as well as identify physical and human features. They will learn about equator, learn about Capricorn
	and Cancer, Norther and Southern Hemisphere and identify them on a map/globe.
PSHE:	Throughout this half term, children will immerse into our school value 'Friendship'
	Throughout this term, children will explore how to manage risks in a variety of places. They will look at how to
	recognize, predict and manage risk in different situations. We will also be looking at how to keep safe in both the
	local environment and online. Finally, we will look at how to report concerns and consider the rules, restrictions
	and laws that are in place.

PE:	Children will be focusing on cricket and athletics this half term. Children will learn how to strike the ball into
	space so that they can score runs. When fielding, they learn how to keep the batters' scores low. In all game's
	activities, pupils have to think about how they use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition.
	In this unit, pupils will develop basic running, jumping and throwing techniques. They are set challenges for
	distance and time that involve using different styles and combinations of running, jumping and throwing. As in all
	athletic activities, pupils think about how to achieve their greatest possible speed, distance or accuracy and learn
	how to persevere to achieve their personal best.
Computing:	This term the children will be developing their knowledge of coding through Learn to Code 2, students will build on their
	fundamental knowledge of Swift. They'll journey beyond simply solving puzzles and create worlds of their own. They'll learn
	about variables and types, the coding constructs that allow them to store and access information. These new skills, along
	with initialization and parameters, will give them even more ways to use code to interact with their characters and the
	puzzle world, allowing them to change the rules of the world itself.
